## Blue-spotted bush frog at Nee Soon swamp-forest

Subject: Blue-spotted bush frog, Rhacophorus cyanopunctatus (Amphibia: Anura: Rhacophoridae).

Subject identified by: Contributor.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island, Central Catchment Nature Reserve, Nee Soon swamp-forest; 23

December 2009; 2010 hrs.

**Habitat**: Freshwater swamp-forest.

**Observer**: Contributor.

**Observation**: An individual of about 3 cm snout-vent length was observed on a frond of a tree fern at about 3 m above the ground at the edge of a stream (Fig. 1). It was moved to low shrub for close-up photography (Fig. 2).

**Remarks**: This species appears to be locally restricted to the Nee Soon swamp-forest, and is regarded as a 'critically endangered' species in Singapore (Lim & Leong, 2008).
