New record of sea slug Chelidonura amoena in Singapore

Subjects: Chelidonura amoena (Mollusca: Gastropoda: Aglajidae).

Subjects identified by: Contributor.

Location, date and time: Singapore Strait, off Pulau Hantu and Pulau Pawai; 23 & 29 November 2014.

Habitat: Coral reef, at depth of about 5 m off Pulau Hantu, and about 7 m off Pulau Pawai.

Observers: Gina Tan (Pulau Hantu) & Contributor (Pulau Pawai).

Observations: Two records at separate localities are herein featured.

1) Two examples of about 20 mm total length were first observed crawling on coral/algae substrate off Pulau Hantu on 23 November 2014 at around 1158 hrs (Fig. 1).

2) Two individuals of about 20 mm total length were observed one lying on top of another on coral/algae substrate off Pulau Pawai on 29 November 2014 at around 1400 hrs (Fig. 2).

Remarks: The examples featured here appear identical to the *Chelidonura amoena* illustrated by Coleman (2008) and Rudman (1998). This species of sea slug is not mentioned by Tan & Woo (2010), and is likely to be a new record for Singapore waters.
