Small cigar stick-insect at the Botanic Gardens

Subjects: Small cigar stick-insect, Orestes mouhotii (Insecta: Phasmida: Heteropterygidae).

Subjects identified by: Francis Seow-Choen.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island, Singapore Botanic Gardens, rainforest; 2 and 25 January 2018; around 2100 and 2200 hrs.

Habitat: Small patch of lowland rainforest surrounded by urban parkland.

Observer: Marcus F. C. Ng.

Observations: A female of about 5 cm total length was found on a leaf of a palm on 2 January 2018 at around 2100 hrs (Fig. 1). A nymph of about 1.5 cm was seen on a railing of the boardwalk on 25 January 2018 at around 2200 hrs (Fig. 2).

Remarks: Although this small stick insect is classified as 'endangered' in Singapore (Seow-Choen, 2008: 103) based on a localised population in one small patch of forest in the Mandai and Upper Peirce area, it has subsequently been found to be very common on Pulau Ubin (Seow-Choen, 2017: 131). The featured examples may be the first records from the Singapore Botanic Gardens.

Orestes mouhotii is known to feed on various species of aroids, Curculigo spp., Leea indica, Dioscorea glabra, Dracaena fragrans, Dracaena godseffiana and the money plant (Epipremnum aureum). It is parthenogenetic and males of this species have not been found in Singapore (Seow-Choen, 2017: 131). The species had been placed in the genera Datames (see Seow-Choen, 1997: 126) and Pylaemenes (see Seow-Choen, 2000: 39).
