Semicircle angelfish off Pulau Hantu

Subject: Semicircle angelfish, *Pomacanthus semicirculatus* (Teleostei: Pomacanthidae).

Subject identified by: Kelvin K. P. Lim.

Location, date and time: Singapore Strait off Pulau Hantu; 13 October 2019; 1445 hrs.

Habitat: Marine. Coral reef, at around 10 m depth.

Observer: Toh Chay Hoon.

Observation: One example of about 15 cm total length was observed swimming just above the substrate (see accompanying photographs.

Remarks: The semicircle angelfish was first recorded from Singapore waters based on a specimen obtained at Tuas in 2013 (Tan, 2014: 26). The example featured here is a smaller subadult in the middle of transitioning from its juvenile colour pattern (see Allen et al., 1998: 89). The middle of its flanks has turned pale while the series of narrow vertical and semi-circular blue and white rings are still apparent.
