OPHIDIA.

Menopeltis unicolor. 20. One specimen contained the remains of a frog (sp. not identified).

Ahaetulla picta. 10, 1 immature. The immature specimen measured; H.& B., 216.3 mm.: Tail, 104.5 mm.: Total, 320.8 mm.. It was taken on the twigs at the outer end of a lower branch of a cinnamon tree.

LACERTILIA.

Hemidactylus frenatus. 10%.

Calotes cristatellus. 1 subadult of.

Draco volans. Two o specimens were obtained during the month. The general colour of the upper parts of the body is a pale grey mottled with darker grey, brown and black. The patagia are boldly barred with yellow. The gular appendage in the females is small in size, and in colour is pale blue spotted with black.

These two specimens neasured: H.& F. 76.1 & 74.1 mm.: Tail, 120.0 & 114.2 mm.: Total! 196.1 & 188.3 mm.: Point of Shout to Centre of Aperture of Ear, 12.7 & 13.1 mm.: Axilla to Groin, 44.9 & 43.5 mm.: Fore leg, 28.7 & 27.9 mm.: Longest Digit on Fore leg. 2.5 & 7.0 mp.: Hind Leg. 34.6 & 32.8 mm.: Longest Digit on Hind Roct 11.9 & 10.7 mm.: Greatest Width across extended Patagia, 75.2 & 72.5 mm.

One Specimen contained three eggs measuring 12.0 x

Mabuia multifasciata. 10. The stonich contents of this specimen were examined by Capt. H. M. Fendlebury and found to contain; a cricket (Gryllidae); a grasshopper of the family Tettigoniidae; a grasshopper nymph of the genus Tagasta, and an unidentified grasshopper; the wing of a Neuropterous insect of the family Chrysopidae; the head of a Digger Wasp; parts of three spiders; and a certain amount of vegetation.

Dr. C. A. Gibson-Hill informs me that at his Hut (No.40) a specimen of this species has been observed to enter the hut

and eat boiled rice from a plate.

Lygosoma bowringii. 29. Capt. Pendlebury examined the stomach contents of these two specimens and found them to contain; an earwing of the Order Dermaptora; two winged ants; a caterpillar of a Geometric moth; and two spiders.
