Biodiversity Record: The stick insect, Lobonecroscia subflava, in Bukit Timah Nature Reserve

Subject: Lobed-legged yellow flyer, Lobonecrosia subflava (Insecta: Phasmida: Diapheromeridae: Necrosciinae).

Subject identified by: Chin Liying Nikki.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island, Bukit Timah Nature Reserve; 7 September 2021; around 1321 hrs.

Habitat: Secondary forest, at the edge of a trail.

Observer: Chin Liying Nikki.

Observation: The featured stick insect, about 6 cm in total length, was found clinging to the underside of a leaf (Figs. 1 & 2). The observer had noticed the insect's abdomen sticking out from under the leaf and went to have a closer look.

Remarks: Lobonecrosia subflava is sexually dimorphic, with the female being much larger (to 62 mm) and bearing prominently expanded fore femora (Fig. 2). The male is small (to 44 mm) and yellowish brown. In Singapore, this rare and poorly known species has been obtained from Bukit Timah Hill in 1994 and the Island Country Club. It has been recorded elsewhere in Peninsular Malaysia (Perak and Penang) and Sabah (Seow Choen, 2000, 2005 & 2017). This species was not encountered during a recent survey of the Bukit Timah forest in 2015-2016 (Seow-Choen et al., 2019).
