## **Common treeshrew at Bedok**

Subject: Common treeshrew, Tupaia glis (Mammalia: Scandentia: Tupaiidae).

Subject identified by: Contributor.

Location, date and time: Singapore Island, Bedok, Kew Drive; 8 July 2016; 1809 hrs.

**Habitat**: Suburban housing estate, with parkland vegetation and low concrete buildings.

**Observer**: Contributor. Image obtained by trap camera.

**Observation**: One adult example of about 20 cm head and body length was found on the roof of a two-storey bungalow house (see accompanying photograph).

**Remarks**: This is an example of the common treeshrew occurring in a suburban housing estate. In Singapore, this squirrel-like creature has been recorded from a similar environment at Portsdown estate (Baker, 2013).
