## Long-tongued nectar bat with pup on Pulau Ubin

Location, date and time: Pulau Ubin; 25 September 2017; 2130 hrs.

Habitat: Rural village.

**Observers**: Noel Thomas, Law Ing Sind and others.

**Observation**: A female was observed hanging from the underside of a coconut palm (*Cocos nucifera*) frond at a height of about 5.5 m. The accompanying photograph reveals the presence of a pup held snugly under the folded wings of the adult (position indicated by arrow).

Remarks: The long-tongued nectar bat appears to have a restricted distribution in Singapore (Baker and Lim, 2012: 162). It was recorded mainly from mangrove habitats on Pulau Ubin, Pulau Tekong and at Sungei Buloh; where it visits flowers in search of nectar (Lim et al., 2008: 193). The featured individual may have been attracted to the durian trees that were flowering nearby (see Phillpps & Phillipps, 2016: 96).
